Merge, the largest to date One Gun Gone exhibition, combines art and activism through the creation and sales of art made from disarmed guns. The exhibition includes the unveiling of welded metal sculptures created through a new collaboration between the Princes 2 Kings, a Providence Boys and Girls Club program, and the Steel Yard, in addition to pre-pandemic visual artwork.

One Gun Gone is a multidisciplinary anti gun violence public art project. Students from underserved neighborhoods in Providence, RI have participated in a professional art making project where students and adult artists transform disabled firearms into artworks that communicate how they feel about gun violence. In the process students are introduced to anti gun violence activists, artists and organizations that work to shift culture and policy to push for safer communities for us all.

The month-long exhibition is on view in the WaterFire Arts Center gallery from Thursday, May 4 through Sunday, May 28, 2023 with an opening reception on Thursday, May 4 from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. The third Thursday of the month, May 18, is <u>Gallery Night Providence</u>, the WFAC gallery as well as other galleries in the city are open late and trolley tours are available. *An artist panel and community discussion will take place within the month, dates soon to be announced.* 

The WFAC store + gallery are open Wednesday through Sunday from 10:00am to 5:00pm and until 9:00pm on Thursdays. The exhibition is free and open to all, donations encouraged.
