**Providence, RI** WaterFire Providence announces The 11th Annual Salute to Veterans full lighting this Saturday, November 4, 2023 supported by <u>Rhode Island Energy</u> & the <u>Manchester</u> <u>Street Station</u>. The lighting will begin at 5:36 p.m. and the braziers will remain lit until 10:00 p.m. On shore programming will open at 4:30 p.m.

"WaterFire's 'Salute to Veterans' event is one of the most moving tributes Rhode Island has to help honor and remember the men and women who have answered the call of duty to serve our nation," said Dave Bonenberger, president of Rhode Island Energy. "As an employer with many veterans across our company, we recognize not only the unique skills and leadership these individuals have, but also the dedication and sacrifices they and their families have made to America. We're proud to support this special lighting, and hope more Rhode Islanders will join us to help celebrate those that have served."

WaterFire Providence will pay tribute to longtime volunteer photographer and Navy veteran John Nickerson, who sadly passed away earlier this year. A single brazier will be lit in his honor and a display of his WaterFire photography will be shown on a screen in Memorial Park.

At 4:30 p.m. the night will kick-off with a speaking program on the basin stage in Waterplace park with remarks given by Kasim Yarn, Director, Rhode Island Office of Veterans Affairs, Governor Daniel J. Providence Veterans Affairs Regional Office. The keynote speaker will be Rear Admiral Pete Garvin from the Naval War College.

The speaking program will also feature a performance by the Army 88th and Navy Band. Once the speaking program concludes, around 5:30 p.m, the Rhode Island Professional Fire Fighters Pipes and Drums group will perform as 100 veterans and active-duty service members process into the basin with lit torches and surround Waterplace Park with a Ring of Fire.

Starting at 7:30pm, wreaths will be laid at the World War, World War II, Korean and Rhode Island Nine Beirut Memorials while taps plays throughout Memorial Park. <u>Rhode Island Energy</u> will illuminate all of the monuments in lights in honor of all of our Veterans.

<u>Stanley Tree</u> is sponsoring an installation of 100 American Flags on Memorial Boulevard lining the river with another 100 American Flags in the basin of Waterplace Park. In addition they will also be sponsoring the American flag over the Steeple Street Music Stage. The large American flag flying over Waterplace Park is presented by men and women of the Providence Fire Department in honor of all veterans in Rhode Island.

On the confluence, where the rivers meet, there will be a Missing Man Table set up to honor the memory of fallen, missing, or imprisoned military service members. Every piece of this touching memorial has a special meaning, and we invite the public to join us in taking a moment to think about our soldiers that are no longer with us or are missing.

WaterFire Providence will be hosting a Veteran's Resource Fair on the Washington Street Bridge starting at 4:30 pm. The fair will include the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps, <u>Rob Levine &</u> <u>Associates</u>, Electric Boat, <u>Chisholm Chisholm & Kilpatrick LTD</u>, <u>Rhode Island FC</u>, and the <u>Rhode Island Department of Labor & Training</u>. There will also be a Mobile Vet Service vehicle provided by <u>United Way 2-1-1</u>.

Visitors can explore through a fleet of military vehicles thanks to Bruce Ferreira and members of the <u>Rhode Island Military Vehicle Collectors Club</u> (RIMVCC) on the College Street Bridge.

WaterFire Marketplace will return to Canal Street, stop by to support WaterFire with a donation or a purchase of locally designed apparel, glassware, books, and gifts. Make a quick and easy donation with the DipJar and glass blowing by <u>Gather Glass</u>. WaterFire will also have additional ambassador and merchandise stations in front of the RISD Auditorium, and both sides of the basin in Waterplace Park.

The WaterFire Arts Festival Plaza will be on Washington Street and Steeple Street, shop this gathering of local artists and makers in mediums such as glass, photography, sculpture, jewelry and more.
